Breakthrough cancer pain is traditionally managed with oral, immediate-release opioids However, because of its sudden onset and severity, oral opioids often fall short of providing adequate control Research into novel approaches to pain management has identifi ed several innovative strat-egies for this diffi cult cancer pain problem

Effective pain management cuts across professional boundaries with clinicians' failure to routinely screen and assess for pain contributing to the burden of unre-lieved cancer pain experienced by 39-66% of cancer patients [1] To date, most research has focused on testing new cancer pain treatments, with little attention paid
