The first city and county in Georgia to consolidate, the City of Columbus and Muscogee County consolidated in 1970 as Columbus, Georgia. The move toward consolidation occurred over more than two decades. During the 1950's local leaders debated the possibility of merging city and county departments that provided similar services.
