A similarity between toads and frogs is that most toads lay eggs just like frogs, but if you encounter a clutch of frog or toad eggs, you can usually tell them apart by the clustering. Frog eggs are laid in tight circular batches. In contrast, toad eggs are usually laid in long strings.
